Welcome to Issue 001 of Photographique!

If you aren't familiar with us, we are in our third year of publishing artistic showcase magazines. Our bi-monthlies Novum Artis and Monochromica have brought attention to hundreds of artists, in practically every art media format you could imagine.

But one type of media has proven slightly controversial: Photography.

There's an argument over whether or not photography is "art." From day one, artists worried that a camera simply records what is already there, outsourcing authorship to a machine —much like today's AI conundrum. Traditional art forms like painting and sculpture demand visible labor, while photography appears quick, repeatable, and tied to commerce.

The counterargument can easily be given by every photographer. Choice is everywhere. Framing, timing, light, lens, process, and context all shape meaning. A photograph is not the world, but a decision about how the world should be seen. The fact that the medium has technical constraints does not make it less expressive, any more than a piano limits the type of music you can create.

Two issues perpetuate the argument: 1) Everyone now has a high quality camera in their pocket (but not everyone can artistically compose/frame/edit and tell a story with their shots); and 2) Photography has an inherent closeness to reality. It asks us to accept that interpretation can look factual. For artists and galleries, that tension is not a weakness. It is photography's most interesting feature.

Do WE think photography is art? That's easy: **YES.**

BIOGRAPHY

Ed Gallucci is a photographer with 55 years of experience. His portraits of musicians and celebrities have been published in *Crawdaddy*, *Rolling Stone*, *Playboy*, and *Penthouse*, and his editorial photographs have appeared in *Business Week*, *Fortune*, *US News & World Report*, *Discover*, *New York Magazine*, *Psychology Today* and *Science* magazines, as well as on more than 40 covers of *Newsweek*. His works, among them a portrait of Bruce Springsteen, are in the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art permanent photography collection in Kansas City, Missouri. Ed is one of the first photographers to photograph a young Springsteen and the future E Street Band. The Bruce Springsteen photographs were featured in a one-man show, "The Crawdaddy Years and Beyond", at Monmouth University October 2012. Forty of Ed's RnR photographs are currently in the permanent collection of the "Bruce Springsteen Archives & Center for the American Music, at Monmouth University in West Long Branch, NJ. Ed has lectured on the art of photography at Monmouth

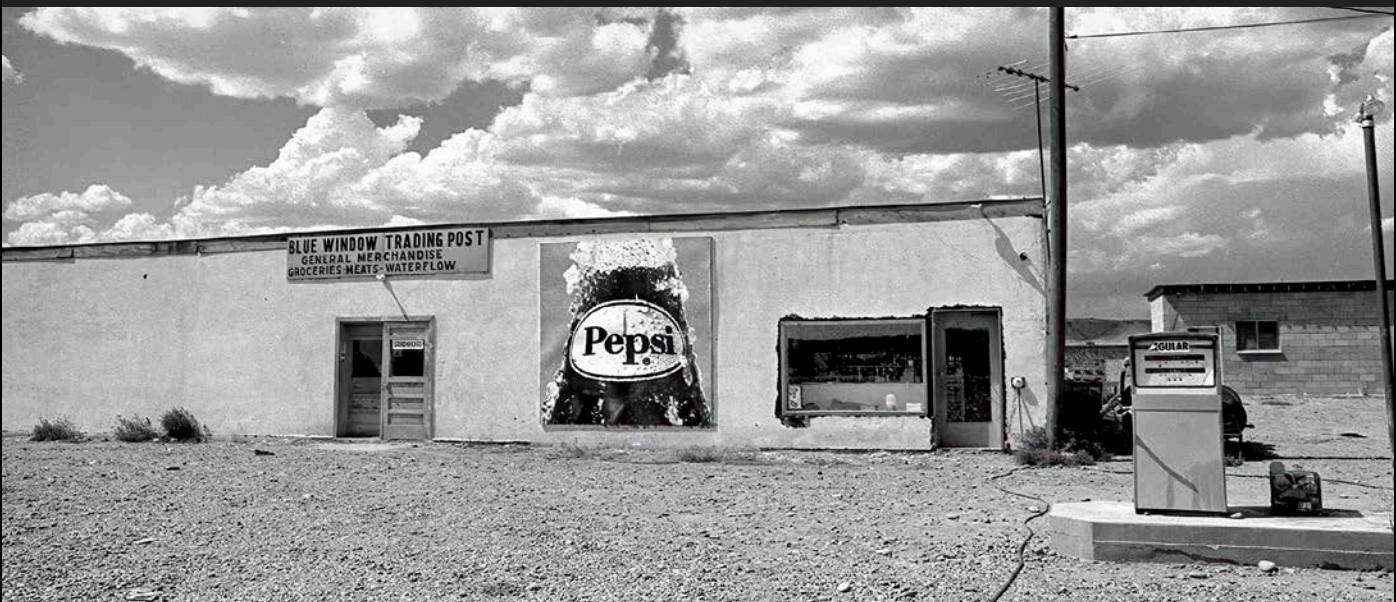
University, Montclair State University, Pratt Institute, and Princeton University. A life-long dream, six of Ed's B&W photographs were made part of the Brooklyn Museum's permanent collection in October of 2013. Ed has since had a one-man show exhibiting photos from his collection *Frames Between Fares* at the O. Winston Link Museum in Roanoke, VA July 2014. Photos from Ed Gallucci's Bruce Springsteen collection were a part of the Los Angeles Grammy Museum's traveling show, "Bruce Springsteen: A Photographic Journey" documenting the early days of Springsteen's career. The traveling show began at the Woodie Guthrie Center a museum in Tulsa OK in 2014 and ended its display at the Morven Museum and Garden in Princeton, NJ May 2017. Gallucci was born and raised in Park Slope Brooklyn, graduated high school in 1964 Berkeley Heights, NJ, studied graphic design and has a BFA in photography from the KCAI 1967-2013

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

When I was first introduced to photography as a young man, at Art School, I was struck and inspired by works of the French Magnum photographer Henri Cartier-Bresson. His dedication and patience that he exhibited in capturing the moment on each and every frame of his work has inspired me my whole career as a professional photographer.

BIOGRAPHY

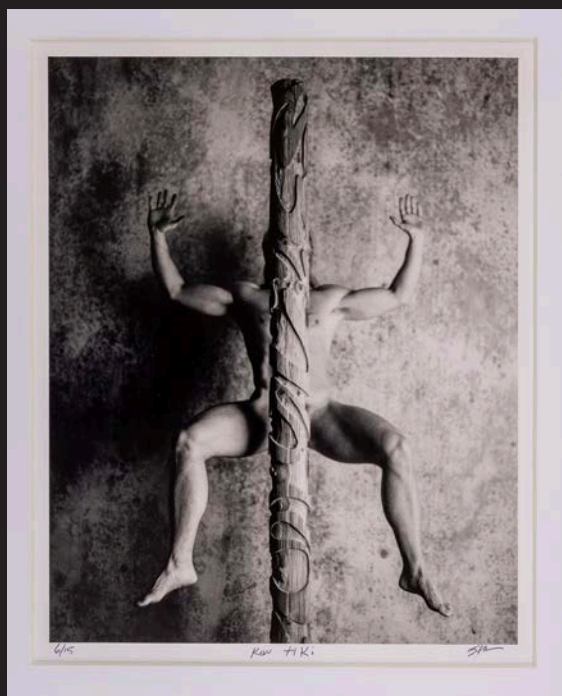
Steve Jensen has been a working artist for over 45 years. His current body of work, "VOYAGER" are boats that are meant to symbolize a voyage or journey, perhaps it is the voyage to the other side, or the journey into the unknown. Steve comes from a long tradition of Scandinavian fisherman and boat builders. He grew up on and around his father and grandfather's fishing boats in the Seattle shipyards. Steve has has solo exhibitions in 30 museums or art centers including The Morris Graves Museum, 30 public art projects including The National Nordic Museum, and received 10 awards including The National Endowment for the Arts. His work was featured by Channel 9 "Art as Voyage" Steve Jensen's Nordic Heritage and Amazon Prime, "The Story of Art in America" episode 10.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

Sculpture/Sculptor The act of making art results in a relationship between artist and work. In this series, "Sculpture/Sculptor", this premise is explored, in pursuit of a synthesis of artist and work. The artist becomes one with the art. Flesh and metal are juxtaposed as the artist interacts with the sculpture. The models are myself and my assistants. The camera is the tool which captures the moment of impact between form and figure. Light and shadow play a fundamental role in defining the 3-dimensional quality of the work and shadow itself becomes an element in the composition of the finished print. Fine art photography and sculpture are opposite forms of expression. The the combination of such opposites, many emotions can be open for interpretation. This series attempts to capture different moods, the intimacy of the relationship between the artist and his work and emotions from the classical figure to a contemporary whim. The relationship has come full circle. Artist and work form a new dimension.

MARIA COLETSIS



BIOGRAPHY

Maria Coletsis is a contemporary artist whose work combines photography, digital media, and public installation to explore identity, sexuality, and environmental consciousness. Her work often begins with the tangible — the human form, natural materials, or cultural artifacts — and transforms these through digital intervention to question how identity and environment adapt in a time of ecological and technological flux. Her recent projects include Seamless for the LA Billboard Public Art Exhibition 2025, Intermission for the London Underground Art Innovations Project at Great Portland Street Station, and Drift WoodScapes for the Richmond Public Art Program. She holds a BFA from Emily Carr University and an MFA from the San Francisco Art Institute, and has exhibited internationally. Coletsis continues to investigate the intersections of body, landscape, and transformation, using natural forms as a lens to reflect on human experience and environmental responsibility.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

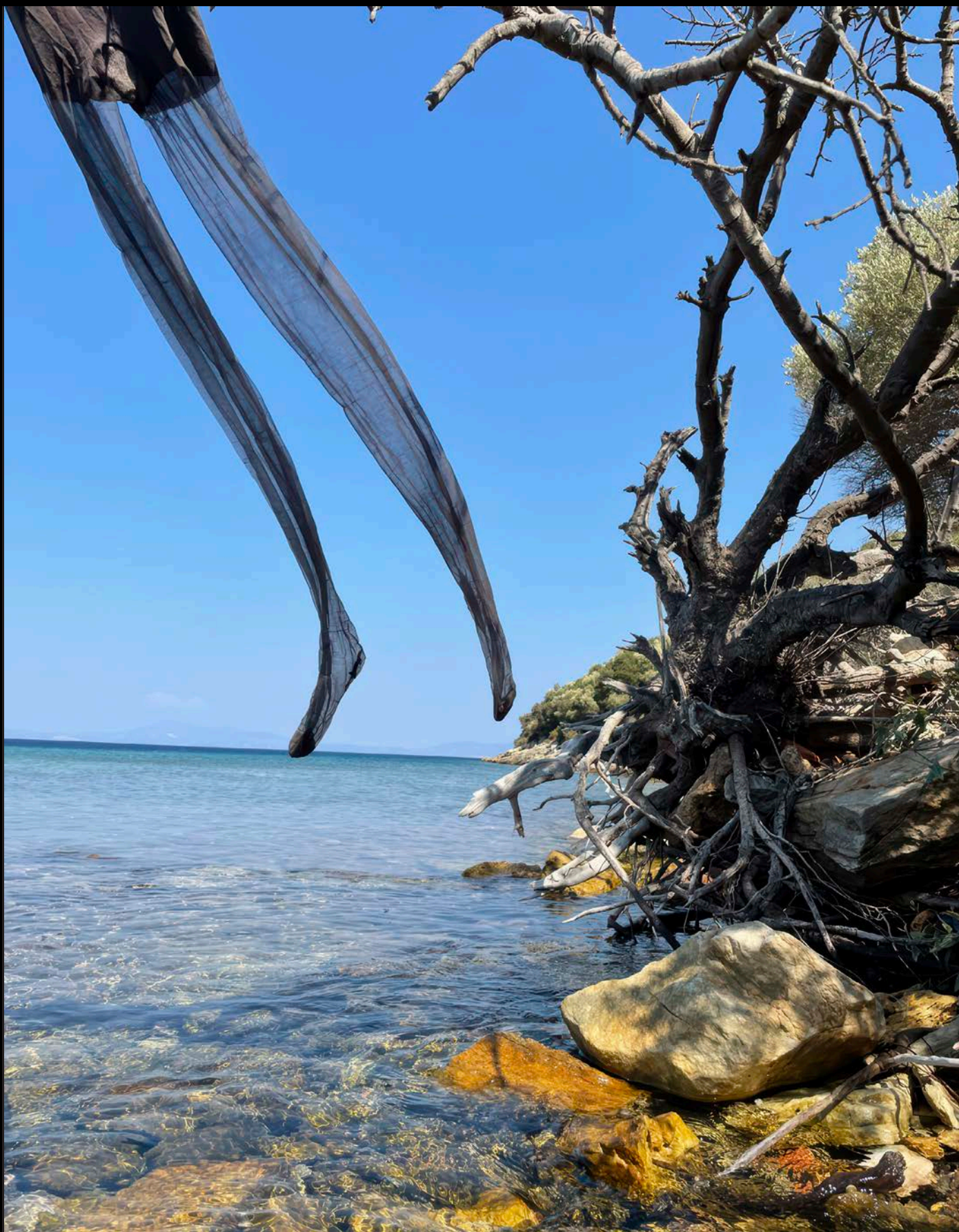

BIOGRAPHY

Jeremiah A. Gilbert is an award-winning photographer and travel writer. His travels have taken him to over a hundred countries and all seven continents, while his photography has been published internationally and exhibited worldwide. He is the author of four travel books. His most recent, *Around the World in Eighty Photos*, includes images created over twenty years of traveling. Each photo is accompanied with a brief story of how the image was created along with the camera settings used.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

Jeremiah A. Gilbert's artistic journey began not with a map, but with a sense of wonder. Over the course of visiting more than 100 countries, his camera has been both compass and confidant, guiding him through bustling markets, remote villages, and landscapes where the horizon feels infinite. His creative vision is rooted in curiosity—seeking out moments that are both intimate and expansive, where the quiet details of a place reveal its deeper story. His photographs are less about ticking destinations off a list and more about tracing the threads of humanity that weave the world together. Inspired by fleeting light, unguarded gestures, and the textures of everyday life, his work captures not just the way a place looks, but the way it feels to stand there, breathe it in, and become part of its unfolding narrative.

NATALIA RADZIEJEWSKA

BIOGRAPHY

Born in 1977 in Łódź, Poland, Natalia Radziejewska immigrated to the United States at the age of four. Growing up in New York during the 1980s fostered a deep fascination with visual culture and the power of photography to record everyday life. At the age of ten, Natalia received a first camera—a promotional gift included with a Time Magazine subscription—and began exploring image-making as a form of observation and storytelling. Throughout high school, this early passion developed into a sustained artistic pursuit. At age twenty, Natalia acquired her first SLR camera and joined the school yearbook staff at her college, where she studied History of Photography and learned traditional darkroom processes alongside the foundations of photographic narrative. A formative period of study abroad in Denmark further shaped Natalia's visual sensibility. Working with a Canon SLR, she documented everyday life and travel, creating a cohesive body of work that marked a transition from casual

snapshots to deliberate photographic compositions. Following graduation, Natalia relocated to Washington, D.C., and began a career as a journalist on Capitol Hill. During this time, she continued photographing congressional hearings and political events, publishing work in various Washington-based publications. The experience deepened her understanding of documentary practice and the intersection of image and narrative. Later, Natalia moved to Boston, where she began working in education, serving as both teacher and activities coordinator. Photography remained integral to this work, as she documented campus life and student engagement for institutional publications and marketing materials. Natalia continues to teach and produce new photographic work at Boston University. In 2022, her photographs were featured in an exhibition in New York, reflecting an ongoing exploration of human presence, place, and memory.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

My photography reflects my unique view of the world. Captured through an adventurous and whimsical lens, her art memorializes key moments in time and presents them in a thought-provoking way that engages audience far and wide.

ERAN FRAENKEL



BIOGRAPHY

Eran is a self-taught visual artist whose path into art was a reaction to a professional life of words. He spent 22 years abroad, in 4 countries, using words to help resolve various conflicts. Although he has been an avid photographer since the 1970s, he only began to draw while living in Indonesia in 2008. Eran is intrigued by whether “you know what you like” or “like what you know.” He belongs to the first group, wanting first to attract viewers who will become curious about what he does and why. His art is rooted in his musical background. The main qualities are harmony, balance, rhythm. Coherence depends on the right mix of these elements, regardless of medium or size. He often says he hears what he sees; namely he reacts to the tonal and rhythmic qualities around him as he works. His work is often asymmetric with balance and harmony coming from fluidity between sections of any image. Having lived in the Middle East, SE Asia, and Spain, he identifies 3 main influences

on his work: First is Islamic art; especially the geometricity and surface design found in illuminated manuscripts, Arabic calligraphy, and mosques. In Indonesia, he learned to scuba dive and has devoted time to marine conservation. Thus, some of his art is intended to raise awareness of, and interest in, protecting the oceans. Barcelona captured his imagination due to its location on the Mediterranean; its legacy of Moorish art; and the ubiquity of Catalan modernisme. Since arriving in Providence in 2016 Eran has been more involved with drawing than photography; though he continues to use his camera to capture the extraordinary aspects in daily life. Eran has served on the board of the Pawtucket Arts Collaborative and Providence Gallery Night. He is now an Elected Artist of the Art League RI and an Exhibiting Artist of the Providence Art Club.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

Eran is a musician, visual artist, chronically unemployed social change programming specialist, and avid photographer. His background is in the music(s) of the Balkans and Middle East and he has long been fascinated with Islamic aesthetics such as mosque architecture and woven carpets. Years of ethnographic research in the Balkans taught him to pay attention to the often-overlooked, quotidian aspects of life, which frequently are the most interesting and profound subjects to convey. Eran’s musical sensibility expresses itself in the tempo and rhythm that characterize both his drawing/paintings and his photography. Like many people, Eran began taking photos by capturing “beautiful” scenes in color. And although he still shoots in color, over the years he has become an avid admirer and exponent of black-and-white imagery, both in his photographs and pen-and-ink drawings. By focusing on black and white, he asks his viewers to concentrate on the each picture’s composition and to seek meaning in the underlying content rather than surface beauty. Eran has traveled extensively around the world, both privately and professionally, and has been actively capturing his reactions, emotions, and experiences through photography. After 22 years of living and working abroad, he now resides in Providence, Rhode Island. Eran’s work can be seen on Instagram under the handle Skopjeeran.

ANDREW WOHL



BIOGRAPHY

Though educated in the Sciences, I have always had an eye for the aesthetic. While working as a biologist in Biscayne Bay in South Florida, I appreciated the sights and sounds of a decrepit, but still functioning, deep water dredge churning the mud and swirling the green waters of Florida's coast. Later, while studying mechanical engineering, I browsed the books in the college library's art section while trying to master such topics as differential equations, strength of materials and fluid dynamics. Later still, as an engineer working for large aerospace firms, I never lost sight of the beauty evident in the machinery and materials common in that industry. Largely self taught, my early pursuits in fine art photography have garnered shows at the Kentlands Mansion, the Strathmore Center for the Performing Arts, Hickok Cole Art Night, and the Chastleton Ballroom within the greater Washington, DC area. I have also received awards from the Vienna, Virginia Photographic Society and my work has been acquired both commercially and privately.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

Combining my interests in architectural and street photography, I have created scenes of extreme loneliness and desolation by seamlessly blending multiple photos using the Photoshop "Place Embedded" tool and other editing techniques. Every pixel in each image is from my camera. No "Googled" images or AI was employed. I selected a photo of an abandoned store for the backdrop of this series of composite photos. The single bulb burning in an otherwise dark space created a mood of mystery and desolation. By strategically placing figures of people I have photographed into the scene, I am attempting to create a plausible narrative. Properly positioning each figure is essential to maximize the dramatic effect of the meager light and create a realistic image.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

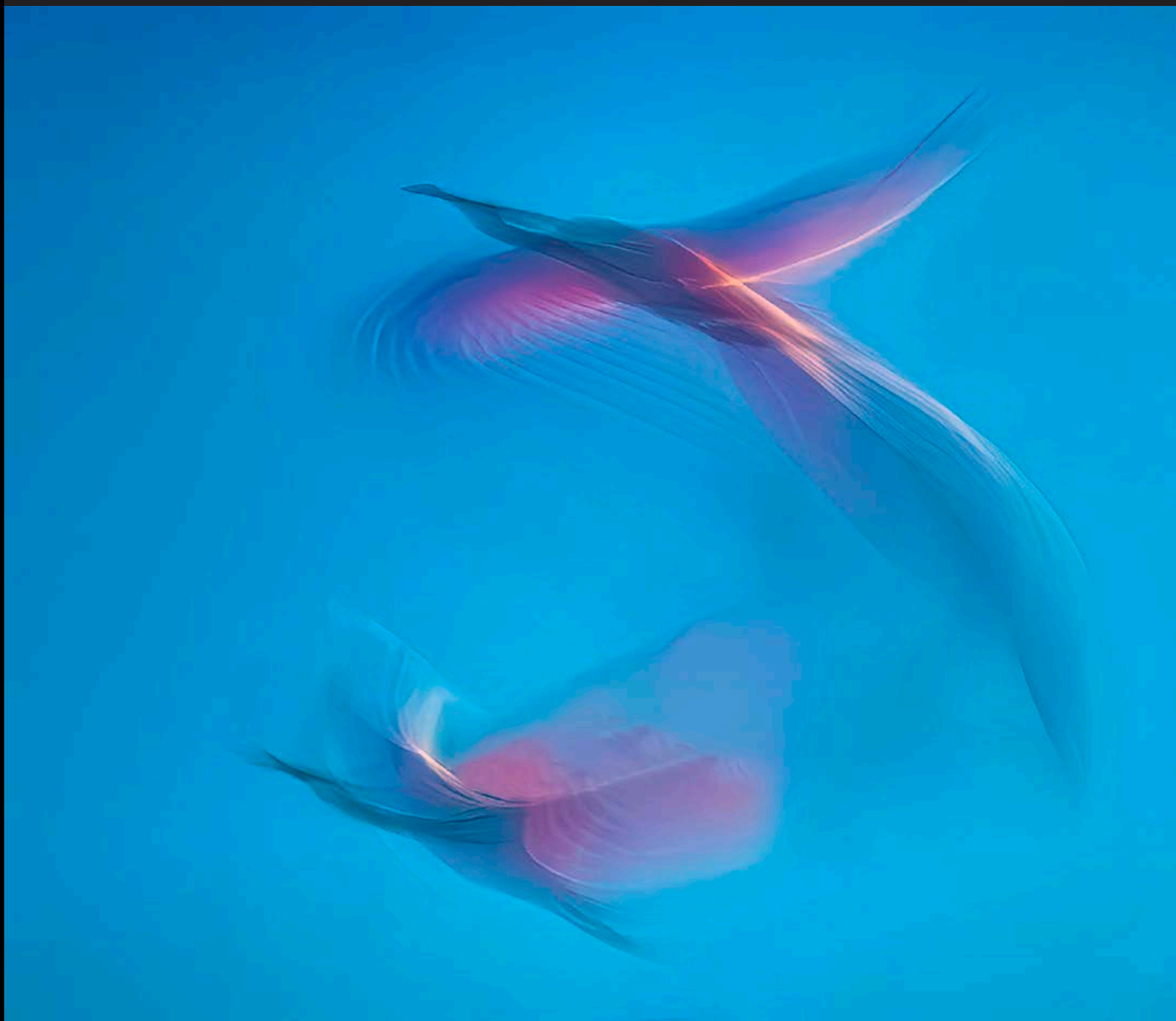

My camera and computer are my paints, brushes and canvas. I use the camera, Intentional Camera Movement (ICM), multiple exposures and the digital darkroom to have the viewer share the emotions and feelings that inspired and prompted me to push the shutter button to capture that moment.

BIOGRAPHY

I started out as a graphic artist—I, quite literally, spent my childhood drawing. My father was a high school librarian and every memo, every announcement, every bulletin that came to the library was then repurposed for me to draw on the back of. It was how he kept me in paper. From there, I became interested in making animated movies—essentially bringing my drawings to life. I shifted, then, to making live action movies (this was the golden age of super-8 movie film). I can't now remember whether I actually applied for or just thought seriously of writing for the application to the New York University Film School—with my father's blessing. He said I had "the eye". But, in the end, I lost my nerve (this was New York in the 1970s) and went, instead, to the small liberal arts college the Fowlers have gone to for several generations. That said, my first advisor there was also interested in filmmaking, so clearly I hadn't given up the idea entirely. It was while I was there that the Metropolitan Museum of Art

held a retrospective of the work of Edward Steichen and Newsweek Magazine, which I was taking at the time, devoted a full page to Steichen's early color photograph of the Flatiron Building. It remains for me one of the most subtle and beautiful photographs ever made. It showed me what photography could be and turned me into a photographer. It's the "ghost" I'm always chasing in my own work.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

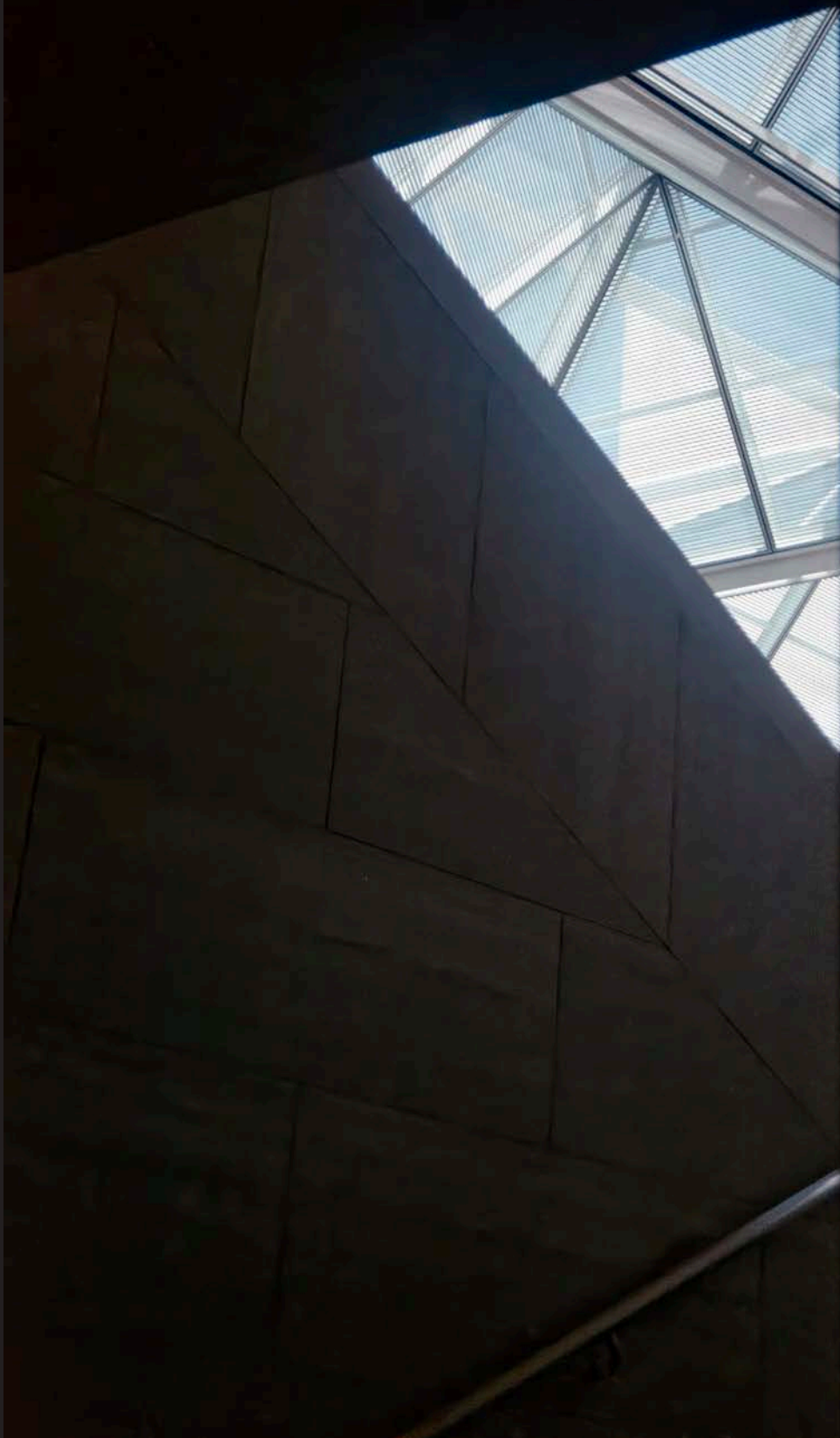
I've found three statements that resonate with my approach to photography: The first is from Dylan Thomas, who said art is about telling the truth. The second is from Georgia O'Keeffe, who said what appeals to us about mountains and rocks and trees is not that they're mountains and rocks and trees, but rather the lines, planes and textures they present to us. The third is from Joseph Campbell, who said it's the task of the artist to convey the radiance behind the physical reality. I don't do photoshop or otherwise manipulate images, aside from cropping and, when needed, truing the horizontals. I don't even use filters or a lot of different lenses (Admittedly I do have a zoom lens, but my tendency is to use it in the wide-angle length so as to get the greatest possible depth of focus). The images are quite literally I saw through the lens. They may not be technically sophisticated, but they are—or at least they are meant to be—deeply felt.

My name is Leslie Struxness. I have been a photographer for more than 20 years. I reside in the Pacific Northwest of the United States, and my background has been in healthcare and farming. I have become an international volunteer and an intrepid adventure traveler. This has brought a new perspective to my photography: the history, beauty, and diversity of people and places, both near to home and far away.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

Our world with all its beauty and wonder is ever-changing. I'm fortunate to travel from my century-old family-owned McMinnville farm all over the world. Sometimes I'm traveling for leisure and other times on medical mission trips.

Wherever I go my camera comes with me. Through my lens I document moments -people, places, culture and diversity. Travel for me has been transformational. It has given me a wider worldview. It provides a window into other perspectives. I'm more knowledgeable, more compassionate and more whole because of the places I've been and the people I've met. And when I come back home to the Pacific Northwest, I come with new eyes. I come with more context about the world. 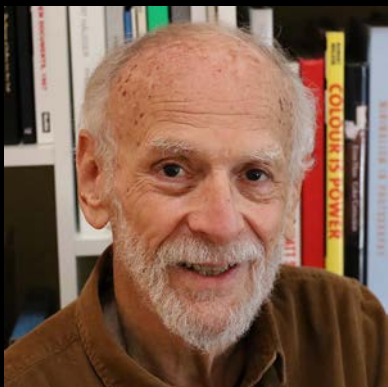

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

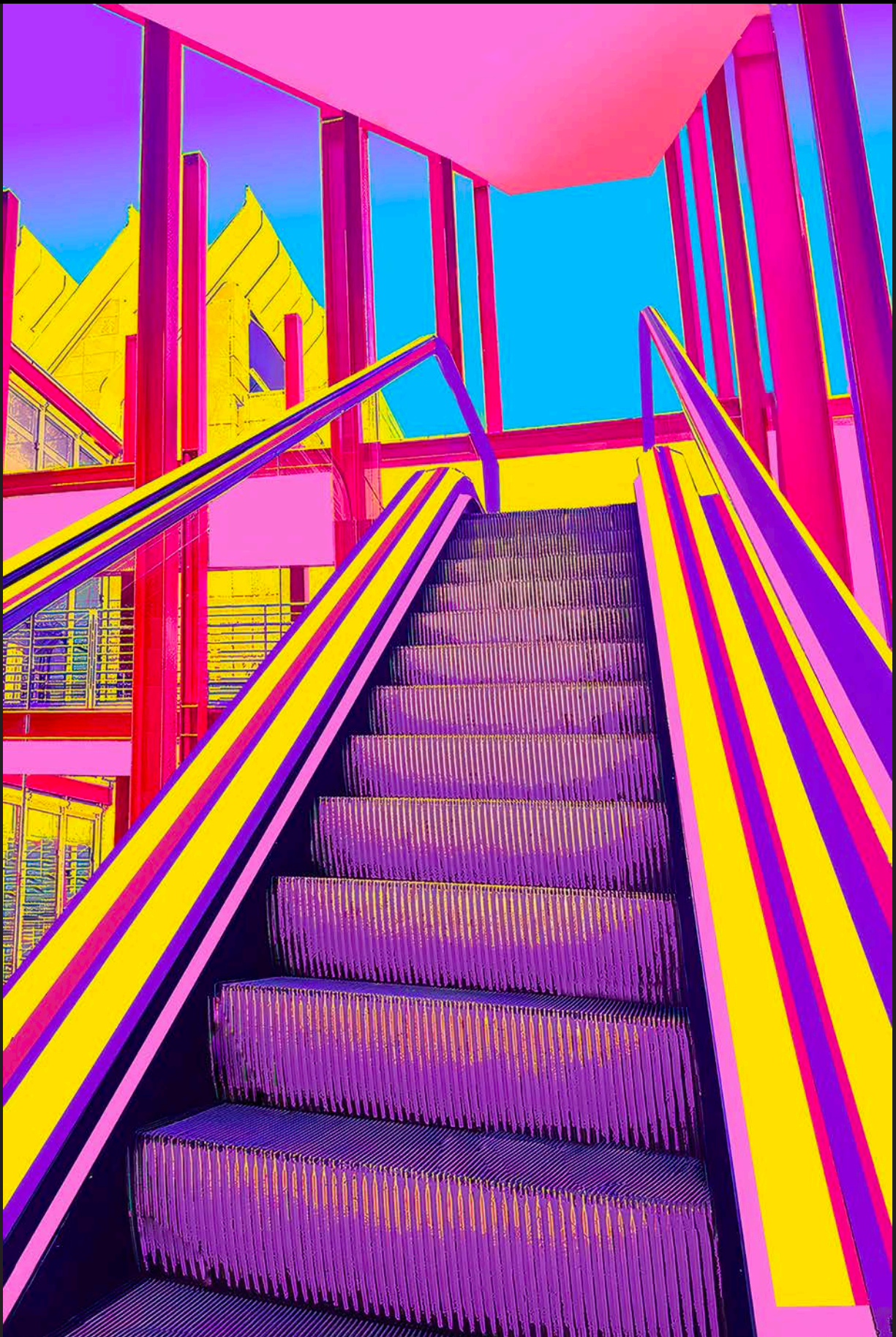

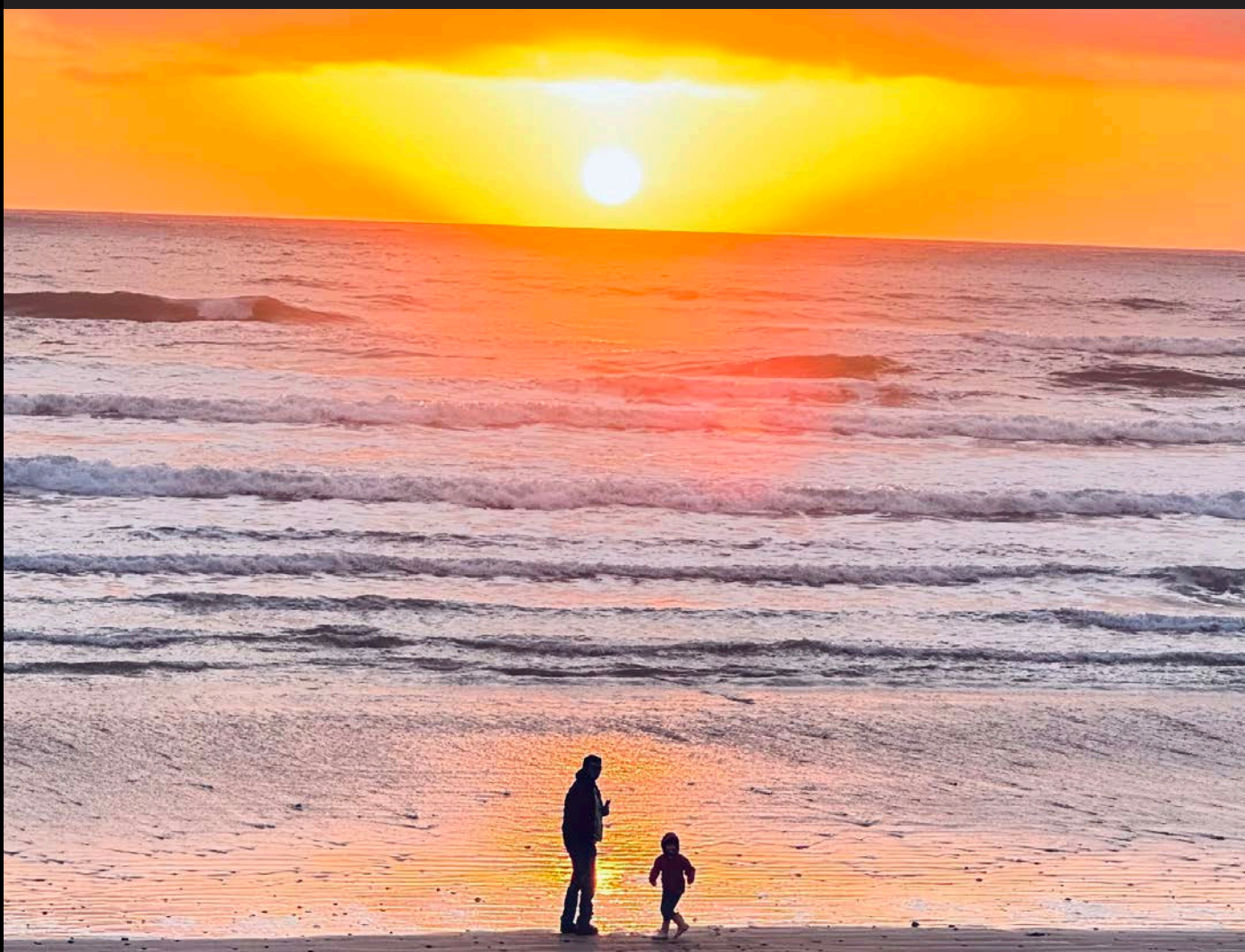

CARLA MEESKE



BIOGRAPHY

Carla Meeske has been photographing for over fifteen years, but her true journey into the night began in 2020, sparked by capturing her first Milky Way image along Arizona's Mogollon Rim. The stars came alive, awakening a vision planted years earlier, in 2006, when CJ Kale's luminous Milky Way work at Hawai'i's LavaLight Gallery first ignited her desire to make images like that, someday. Now she is a photographic cosmonaut, capturing dusky landscapes with shimmering skies across the Southwest. While Carla has mastered the necessary tools, using star trackers and specialized sensors to pierce the dark, her approach is defined by intuition rather than mechanics. She sees her images as portals, merging the ancient stardust of the skies with the grounding beauty of the Earth. Each photograph requires patience and alignment, waiting for the landscape to breathe in unison with the galaxy. A juried member of the Sonoran Arts League, Carla hosts the MilkyNight Studio during the annual

Hidden in the Hills Tour. Her immersive installations are frequently exhibited at the Mayo Clinic in Phoenix, offering a sanctuary of beauty. Living in Scottsdale, she photographs the Southwest, inviting viewers to experience the night sky not just as space, but as a reflection of the spirit within. Prints are custom made on metal or acrylic in sizes up to 60 inches.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

Nightscape photographer Carla Meeske captures striking landscapes beneath the stars—from twilight's liminal glow to the blazing Milky Way core. Her images are portals into the universe and into ourselves. We are unique incarnate signatures created from stardust and Earth, alive and radiant with the beauty of creation. View these images with a dreaming eye and experience the Spirit's breath within you. Using an astromodified camera and a star tracker to ensure sharpness, Carla often devotes an entire night to a single image. The magic comes alive in post-processing, where she enhances the colors and reveals the dramatic interplay between celestial and terrestrial beauty in the Southwest. Printed on semigloss aluminum or face-mounted acrylic, her photographs shimmer with depth. Carla's mission is to bring the night sky's magic into our hearts, reminding us that we stand at the center of the mystical bond between Earth and cosmos. Carla is based in Scottsdale, Arizona, and photographs the Southwest's most striking landscapes, where the cosmos brings the night to life.

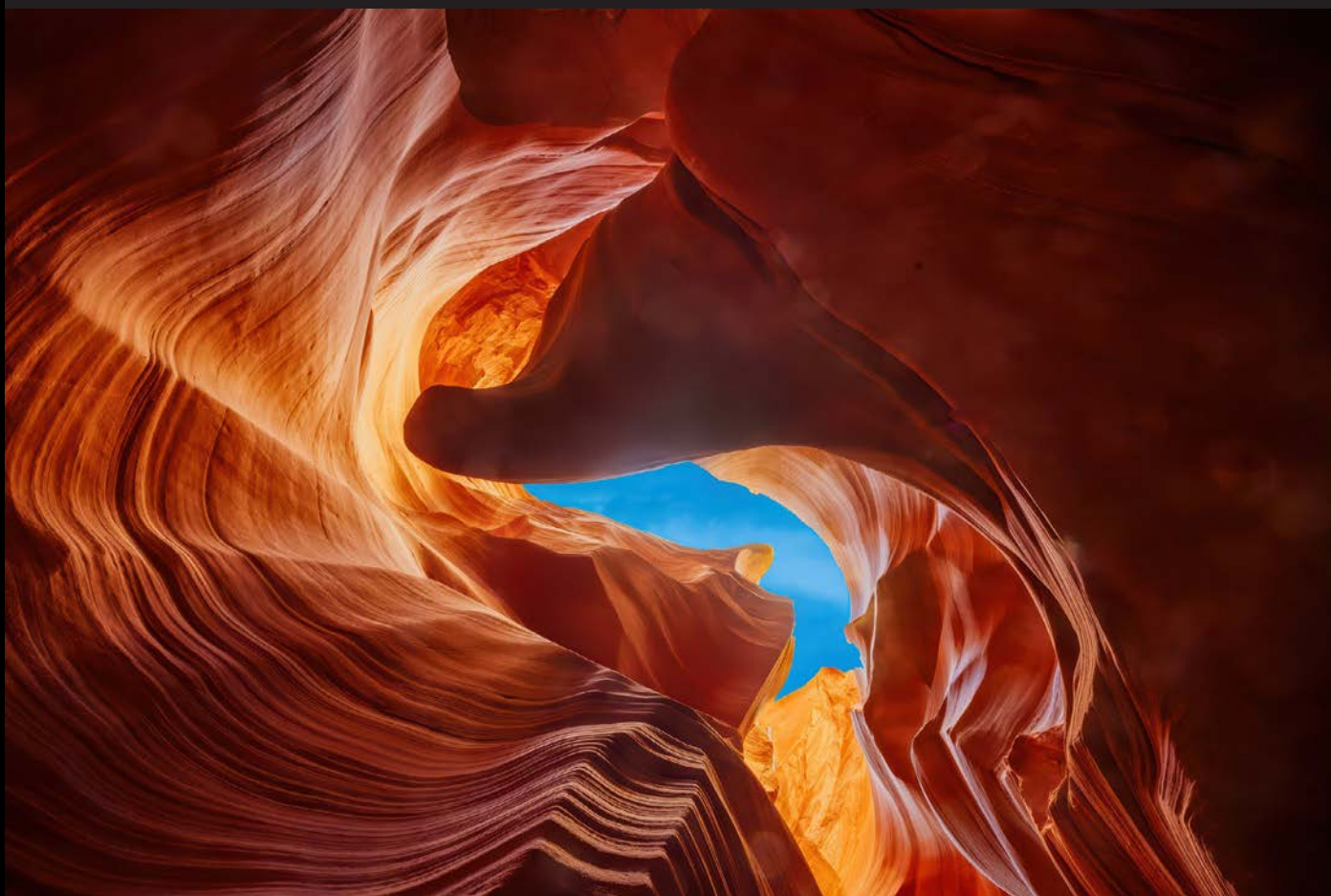

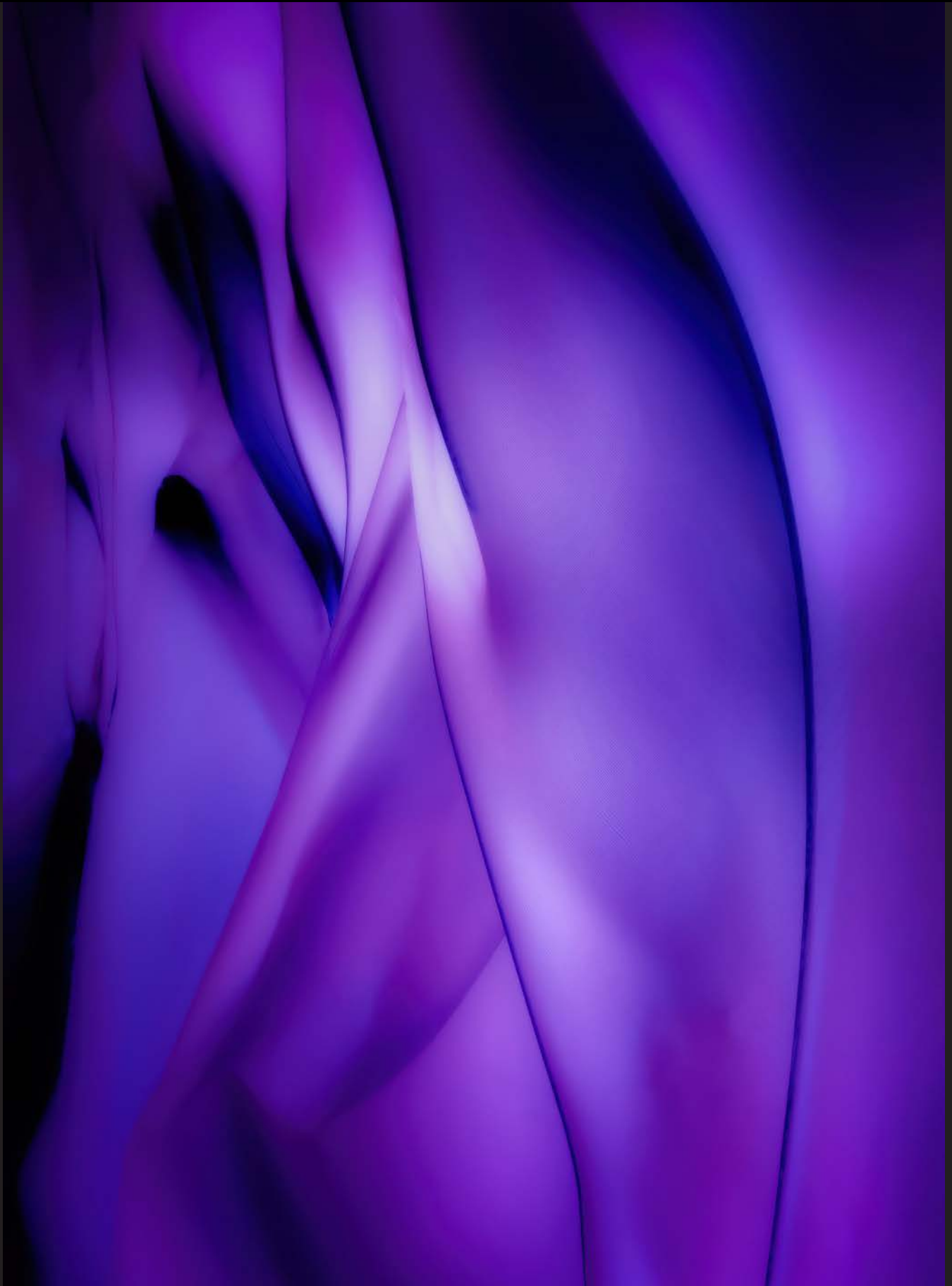

His photographs are not just images but contemplative experiences that invite viewers to pause and reflect on the hidden moments within their own lives. Currently, Todd is focused on expanding his abstract series, pushing

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

While I often work as part of a team in video production, still photography is where I find a more personal, solitary rhythm. It gives me the freedom to explore images and compositions on my own. When I'm out in the field with my camera, I often lose track of time — completely absorbed in discovering artful moments within everyday situations. That search, that act of looking closely and framing what I see, is my form of Art Meditation. I rarely set out with a rigid plan. Instead, I start walking and let intuition guide me. A high percentage of my photographs happen spontaneously — during a walk, in the middle of a workday, or while I'm on what I call a "photo safari." Many of my favorite images come from simply turning a corner and stumbling upon something that stops me in my tracks. I live for those "Woahhhhhh! That's amazing!" moments — when light, texture, and perspective come together in a way that feels fleeting and electric. Sunsets and landscapes often draw my focus. There's something timeless and grounding about them, but I'm also fascinated by the unexpected — the abstract pattern on a sidewalk, the way a shadow stretches across a wall, or a surreal pop of color in an otherwise muted environment. I believe that if you just stop and really look around, there are hidden pockets of beauty everywhere. Photography allows me to connect to the world more deeply, to pause and pay attention, and to express something honest without words. Each image is a result of being present, curious, and open to discovery.

I grew up surrounded by creative people—artists, musicians, writers—but for whatever reason, drawing, painting, and playing music just never clicked for me (hence my motto: “Some of us just can’t draw”). Picking up a camera, though, felt like finding my own way into the creative world. Sometimes what I capture is impressionistic, sometimes it’s more straightforward, but it always gives me a new way to see things. I love spotting something out in the wild and then seeing where I can take it in post-processing. I don’t really call myself a nature photographer, but most of my images are found outdoors. These days, I live in Colorado Springs, right at the foot of Pikes Peak, surrounded by a patchwork of landscapes—towering “14ers,” open plains, deserts, rolling hills, thick forests, and wide stretches of prairie. My husband and I are often out exploring, and those adventures

have inspired many of my favorite images. Over the years, I’ve shared my work in local, national, and international competitions and shows. My photos have appeared in magazines, newsletters, and other publications, and I’ve had the chance to exhibit in both physical and online galleries. I’m grateful for every opportunity to share what I see, and I hope my images bring a bit of that sense of discovery to you, too.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

I’ve found that my best photos are the ones I stumble across when I’m not really looking for them. I like to head out with a “let’s just see what we find” attitude. In other words, no big plans, just a sense of adventure and my camera. It’s become a passport to the unexpected for me, and I love sharing those surprises. I’m drawn to places and objects that have a story to tell (or maybe a secret to keep), and I never quite know what I’ll find. Once I’ve captured the photos, I love to research the history, science, and natural details behind the images. I’m especially delighted when I find a bit of humor, too. I have a soft spot for odd details: quirky buildings, faded signs, or even the way shadows can build the whole mood of a scene. There’s something special about finding beauty (or just plain weirdness) in the overlooked or abandoned, and I try to bring that sense of curiosity and whimsy into everything I shoot. I hope my images invite you to slow down and notice the stories—big or small—that are hiding in plain sight. For me, photography isn’t about chasing perfection. It’s about celebrating the moment, wherever it happens to find you.

Robert A. Ripps work explores the interaction and intersection of nature and the man-made world, both visually, as well as technically. He received his BFA in photography from Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT), and has studied at the Center for Creative Imaging (CCI), and Maine Media Workshops. Robert has won numerous awards, including being named one of the 200best digital artists (2023) by Lürzer's Archive, inclusion in American Photography 36 and 39 Annual Award books, Honorable Mention in the 2021 IPA Int'l Photography Awards, multiple honors from Photo District News (PDN), as well as having his work be a part of the Polaroid collection. In 2020, he was included in the exhibit #ICPConcerned, a selection of photographs collected from the ICP Concerned hashtag on Instagram, and displayed at the International Center of Photography (ICP) in New York. His most recent solo exhibition, Negativityness Abounds, was at the Christine Frechard Gallery, in Pittsburgh. When not traveling the world for business and pleasure, Robert resides in New York City, among many houseplants.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

Negativityness examines the idea that social media and image manipulation can be used to influence society, by distorting the truth, and presenting fiction as fact. This leads to a fabricated narrative, often with dire consequences and outcomes. Currently, everything we see and read in media, social and otherwise, seems to be about negativity, about division, and especially, about what is "the truth" (and what is inarguably false, yet touted as truth). But the surface of things is usually completely opposite from what is underneath. Each faction has their own set of "facts" which they believe with an almost religious fervor, while refusing to accept or even acknowledge anyone else's "facts". This makes it impossible to know where reality ends, and fantasy begins. By using images of flowers, leaves, trees and other organic subjects, then combining and layering them digitally, I seek to create worlds where beauty and impossibility co-exist. I want audiences to entertain the possibility that perhaps there is more to the images than meets the eye. Viewers are encouraged to enjoy the allure of the images, while also acknowledging the incongruity and surrealism that they present. Hopefully they will question how they can exist, how what they see can be real. Are they fact, or fantasy? Or maybe, they contain elements of both.

Further studies include courses at the Maine Photographic Workshops (now Maine Media Workshops) and MECA (the Maine College of Art). C E's studio is located in Cumberland, Maine, where he has lived for the past 30 years. His work has garnered awards in such competitions as: Photo Review, Marin Society of Artists, the International Photography Awards, Tokyo International Foto Awards, Photographer's Forum, Moscow International Foto Awards, Prix de la Photographie Paris, Black & White Spider Awards, Texas Photographic Society, Head On Photo; Sydney, AU, and the International Contemporary Art Awards. His work is included in private and corporate collections. He has been selected for solo and group exhibitions; both nationally and internationally, as well as various publications.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

I spend a lot of time in vintage auto salvage yards and boatyards where I discover incredible visual elements that inspire me the same way as do the great abstract painters. I hunt for this wild art, looking for patterns, color, texture & composition in subjects both man-made and natural; embellished by chance and patinated by nature, with an unspoken history of random events that can only be guessed or imagined. With no reference to the identity or the scale of what I photograph, the abstract imagery coaxes a personal interpretation from the viewer's imagination. "It's not what you look at that matters, it's what you see." - Henry David Thoreau My Farrago images are made by layering abstract details of found objects. The surfaces of the subjects are layered; exposing through deterioration, the layers of paint, rust and patina that over years have revealed their history. I take the layering a step further combining rusty car fenders with boat hulls; dumpsters; broken glass, etc. to create abstract images from an improbable fusion of actual objects. "Art is not what you see, but what you make others see." - Edgar Degas. I am naturally drawn to found objects; their juxtaposition and relationship as still lifes; as well as the aesthetics of wabi-sabi. Recently I have been piloting a drone, creating aerial landscapes with a new perspective, often visually akin to my abstract vignettes of found objects. "The world is full of magic things, patiently waiting for our senses to grow sharper". - W.B. Yeats. Recently, I discovered the unintentionally artistic abstract patterns made by the men who are constantly moving, sorting, and piling various gravels using heavy equipment. They create designs in the earth; the beauty of which, I assume, they are quite oblivious, as their unwitting artistry can only be appreciated from above. The result is the Gravel Pit Series. "The real voyage of discovery consists not in seeking new landscapes, but having new eyes." - Marcel Proust.

BENJAMIN GIBSON



BIOGRAPHY

Benjamin Gibson is a queer Toronto-based photographer and creative director whose work explores the intersection of grit and beauty in urban landscapes and portraits. Gibson explores topics close to his own life as well as topics with a global impact, from recovery to climate change. With a background in commercial and fine art photography, Gibson's style is characterized by its raw, unfiltered approach to capturing the human experience. His fascination with street photography began with a desire to tell stories often overlooked in the hustle and bustle of city/man-made life.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

"Indicators" is a photography exhibition that captures two of Canada's most significant glacial landmarks — the Athabasca Glacier and Victoria Glacier at Lake Louise. Photographed in spring 2023, these large-scale works reveal the breathtaking beauty of these icy landscapes while also documenting their visible retreat, a stark reminder of the impact of a warming climate. This exhibition embodies the central tension that defines my artistic practice: finding beauty in subjects that carry heavier, more troubling meanings. The glaciers, with their sculpted ice and sweeping vistas, inspire awe — yet they are also fragile, endangered, and disappearing before our eyes. By presenting these landscapes at scale, "Indicators" invites viewers to linger in that space between wonder and grief, and to reflect on the possibility that what they see here may not exist for future generations.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

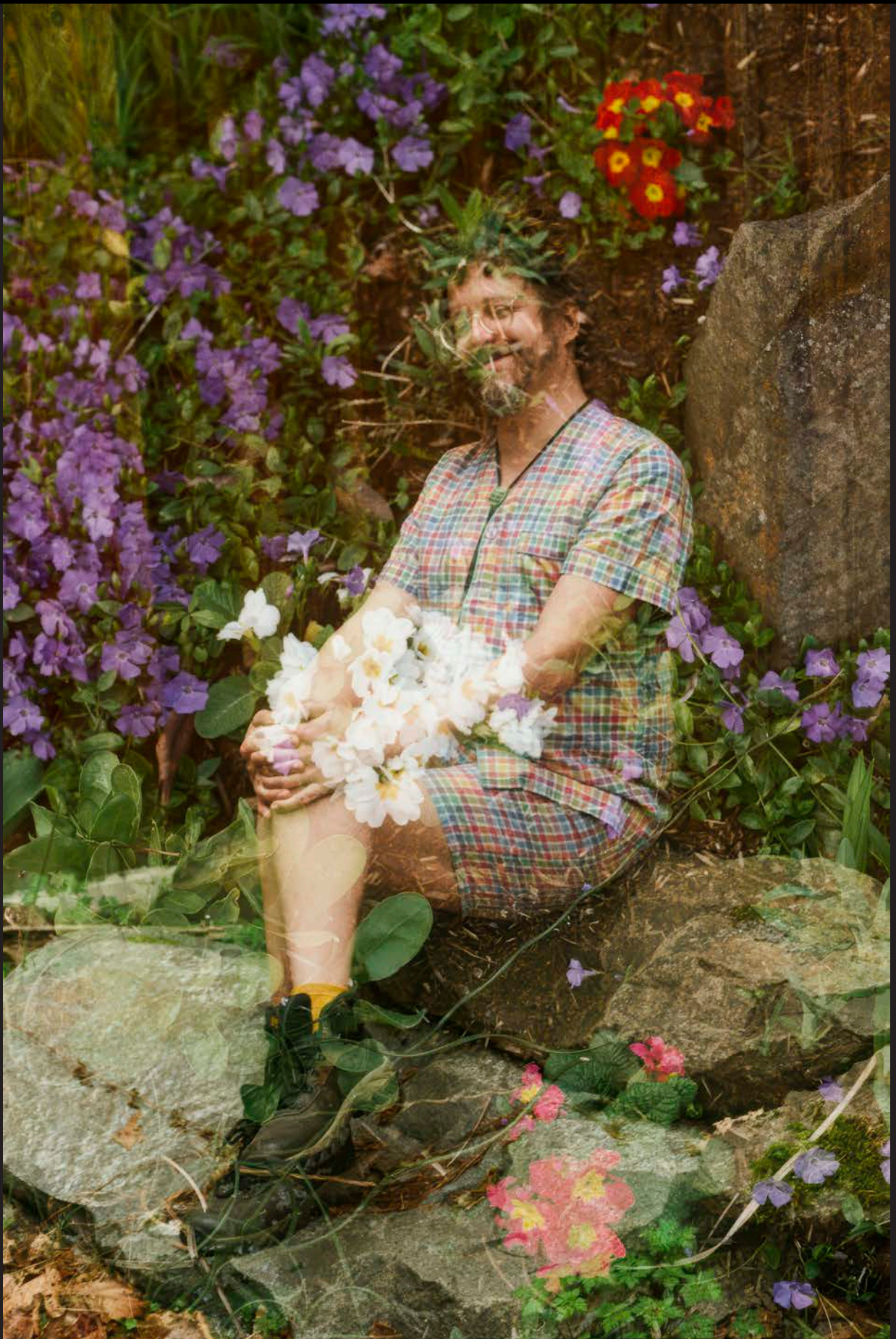

Ann has a variety of photographic-based interests and likes to explore image interpretation by using an array of techniques, including camera-less, analogue and digital media, respectively. This stems from challenging herself technically to create images that attempt to capture the depth, shape and visual impact of the proposed subject matter by presenting it on media that enables an organic type of exploration. This is very much an evolving process, encouraging her to closely examine the living and abstract world and form images that explore the spontaneous nature that subtly exists all around us. SHINGO OHTA



BIOGRAPHY

Shingo Ohta is a Japanese fine-art photographer who has devoted his life to pursuing the raw, ungovernable pulse of the Sea of Japan. After decades as a business owner, he returned—driven by an almost mythic calling—to the coastline of Tajima, where he had spent his youth watching storms fracture themselves upon black volcanic rock. What began as simple documentation soon became a spiritual compulsion: an attempt to seize the instant in which water ceases to be water and becomes a living force, a sculptor, a god. My artistic path ignited in his later years, not as a retreat but as an eruption. With the discipline of a craftsman and the hunger of a novice, I taught myself to read the weather like scripture, to anticipate the breath of the sea before it rose in fury. Standing alone before winter tempests, I forged a practice that is equal parts photography, ritual, and confrontation. My work is not conventional seascape photography. It is an excavation of the boundary between chaos and

form. I treats each wave as a singular living entity—an organism born, evolving, and dying within fractions of a second. Through extreme shutter work and a sculptural approach to composition, he extracts shapes that hover between abstraction and myth: apparitions of foam, liquid architectures, ascending spirits, and violent silences. My practice is rooted in perseverance, solitude, and a fierce devotion to the natural world. His age is not a limitation but a weapon; every image distills a lifetime of experience, discipline, and unrelenting curiosity. Today, My photographs circulate internationally, yet I continues to return to the same stretch of untamed coastline—not to capture it, but to wrestle with it, to listen to it, and to be transformed by it again and again.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

My art begins where language fails: at the moment a wave rises into an impossible shape, becoming something neither solid nor liquid, neither earthly nor celestial. “Ephemeral Creations of the Sea” is my attempt to seize that instant—the threshold where nature becomes pure abstraction, raw emotion, and fleeting sculpture. The sea is not my subject; it is my collaborator, my adversary, my teacher. I work in violently shifting conditions, often in freezing wind and unpredictable surf. These extremes are necessary. Only when the sea is on the edge of losing control does it reveal forms that belong to no human imagination. In those moments, I feel as though I am witnessing creation itself—rapid, destructive, miraculous. My images are not staged, manipulated, or fabricated. They are born from a collision between natural forces and my own instinct for timing, waiting for the second when chaos folds into temporary order. My inspiration comes from sculpture, calligraphy, and abstract expressionism. I seek lines drawn by water, volumes carved by wind, gestures thrown by waves as if they possessed a will of their own. Each photograph captures a unique genesis: the birth of foam, the rise of liquid architecture, the eruption of stardust-like spray. These shapes exist only once and for less than a heartbeat. When I press the shutter, what I capture is not the sea itself, but its fleeting consciousness. Through this series, I wish to confront the viewer with the overwhelming truth that all things—beauty, violence, creation—are temporary. The sea reminds us that impermanence is not loss; it is movement, energy, life. My work is a hymn to the forces that shape our world, a visual record of their brief, luminous appearances before they dissolve back into the deep.

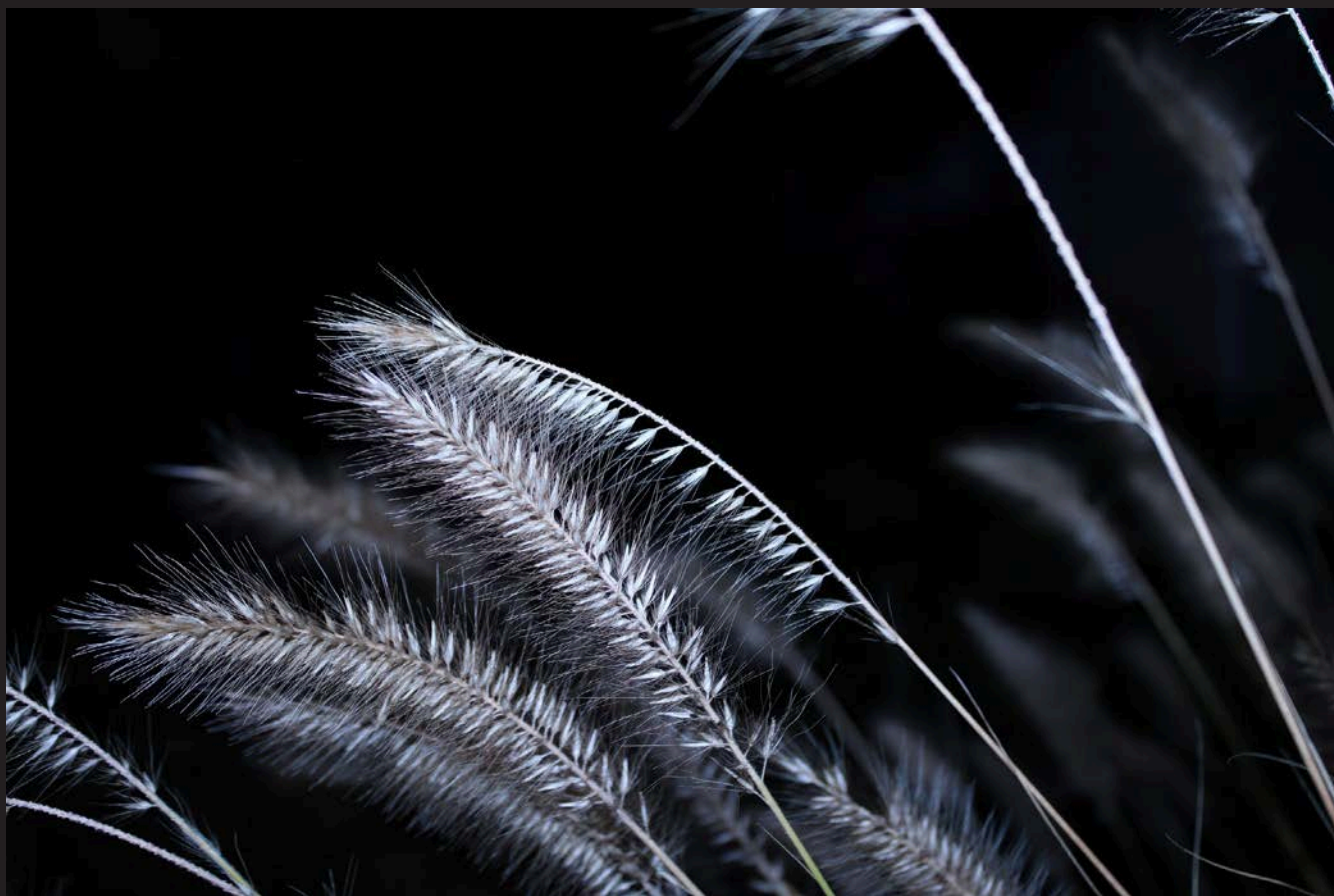
My name is Conor Stahl. I am an aspiring photographer, living in Long Beach, NY. I am inspired by the different seasons, as well as animals and insects in nature.

ARTISTIC STATEMENT

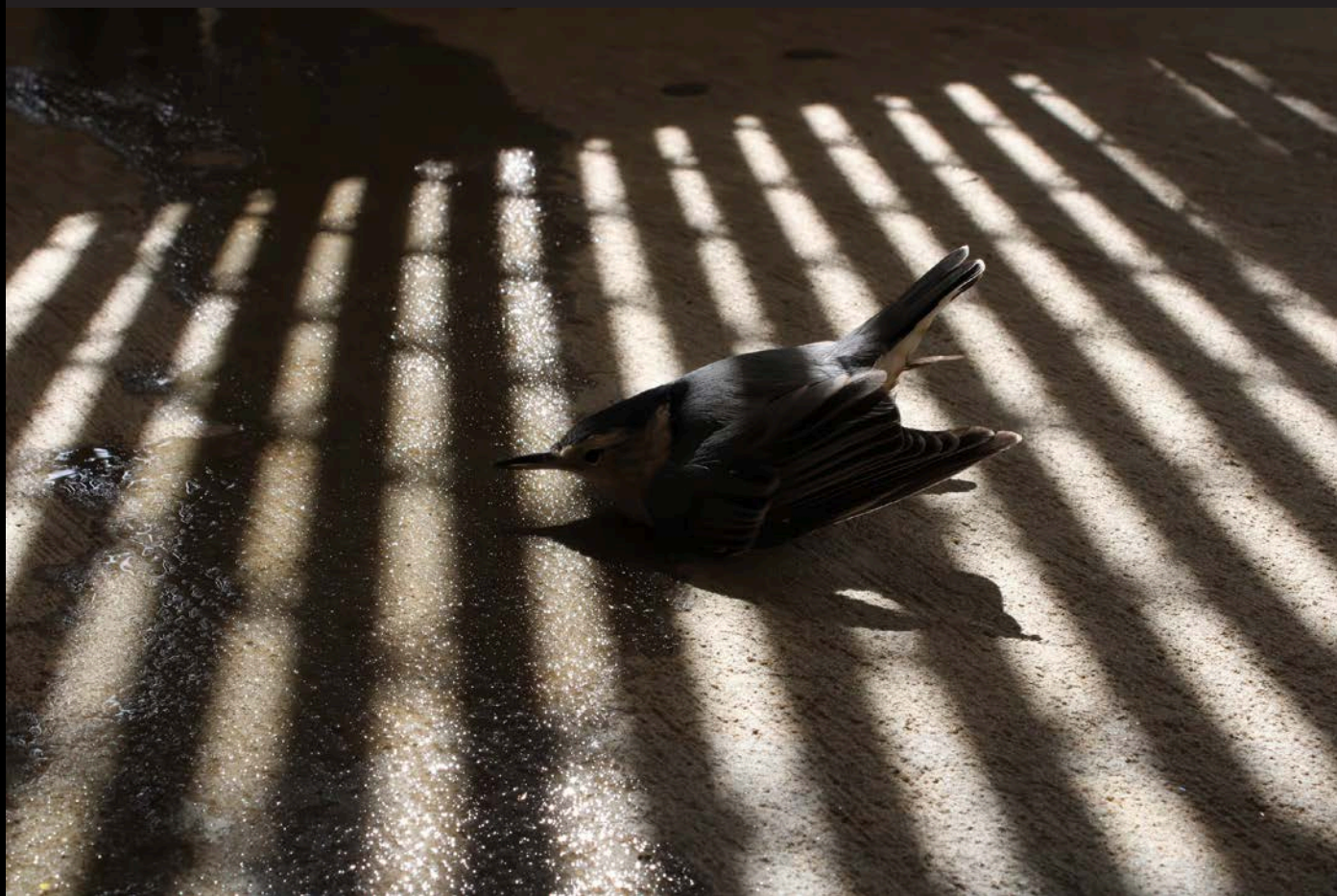

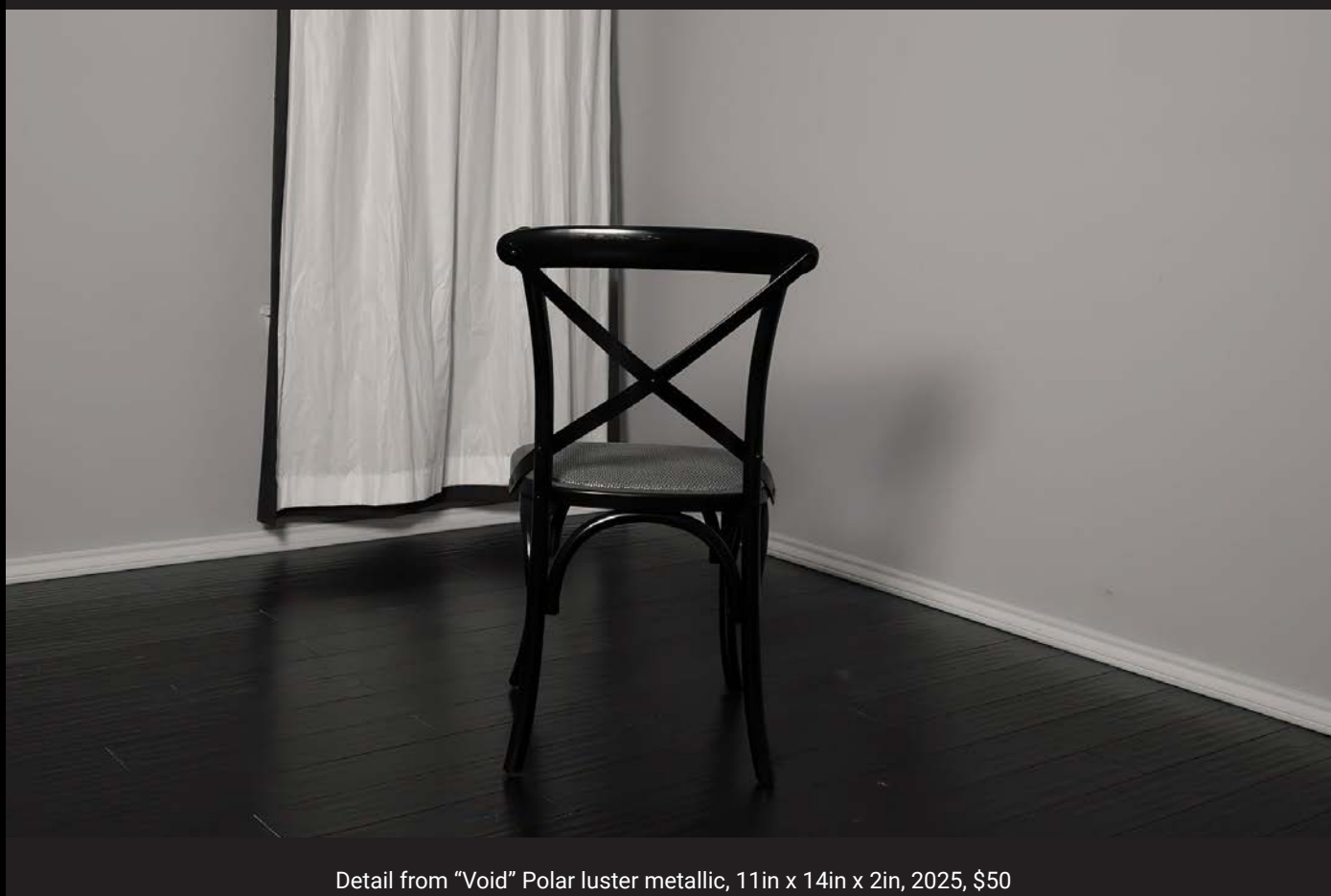

BIOGRAPHY

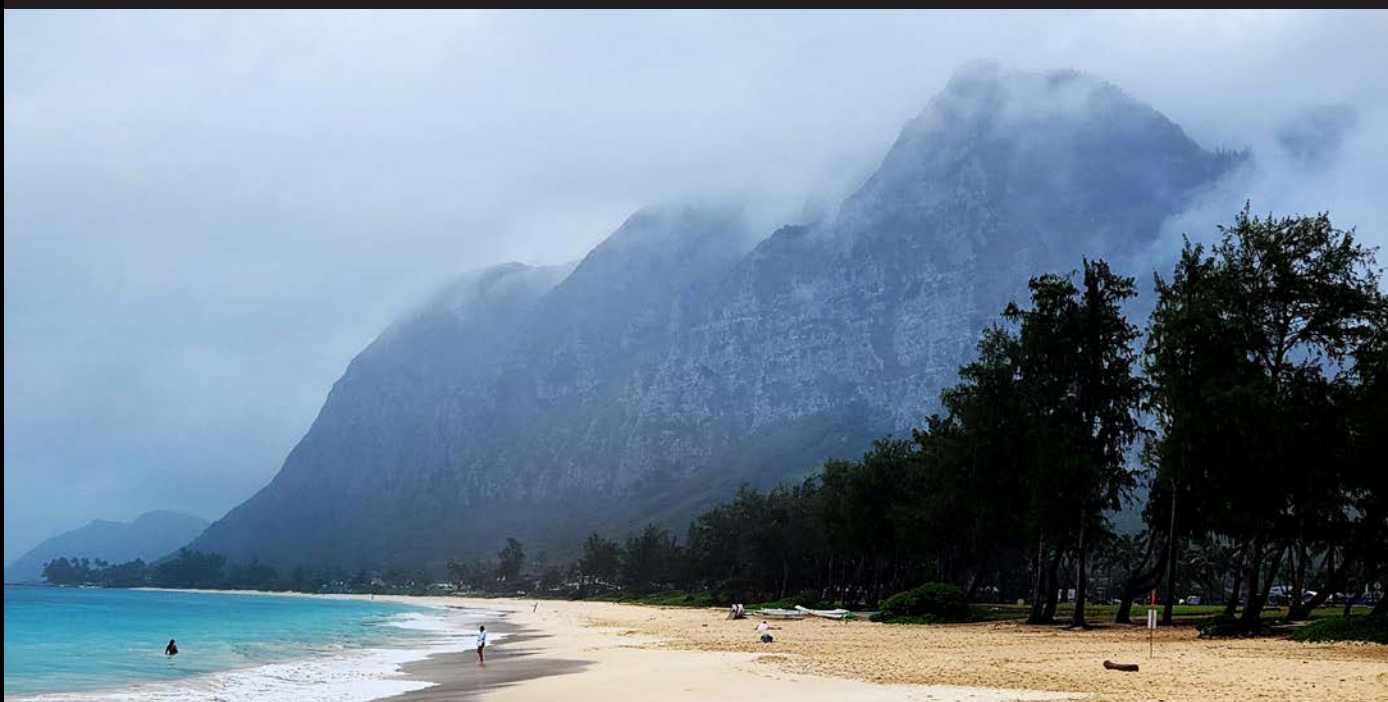

I believe that no methods are off the table, though I like to take the results of those methods and manipulate them by hand to fit my artistic vision. For my digital collage portraits, I typically start with a photograph of the face. In Photoshop, I manually manipulate and change the face, while painting over it to transform it into a unique work. I then blend a mix of elements, including real world, hand-drawn, and AI-generated, all manipulated and painted as the face was, to create my finished digital collages. Thus, even automatically generated elements are transformed into true human-made art.
